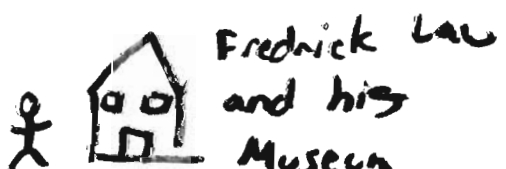

Frederick Law Olmstead is the world's most famous landscape architect. You are probably wondering what the heck a landscape architect is and what it has to do with the program. Landscape architects design parks and gardens and other outdoor stuff. Not only do they make the blueprints or floorplans of what the place will look like and make it pretty, but they also must make environmentally safe places. For example, it would not make sense to plan a park with flowers that need water in a place like the desert because the plants would die, or plan to build a walkway on a very steep hill because then no one would be able to use it. A landscape architect is in charge of making a plan that fits its environment.

Olmstead is best noted for his work in creating and masterminding the great Central Park in New York City. Today we will be visiting the offices and house of Olmstead where all the creations started. 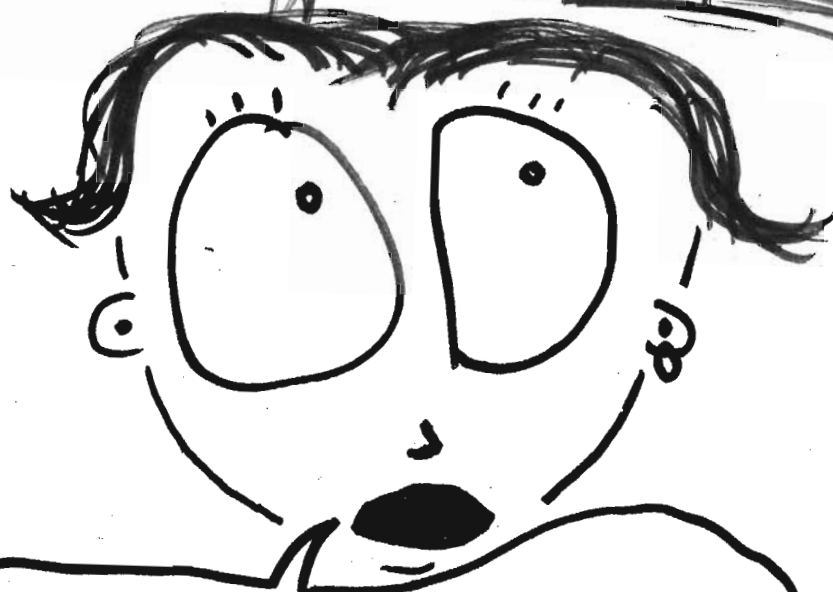
