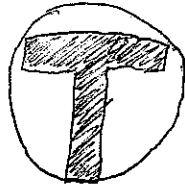
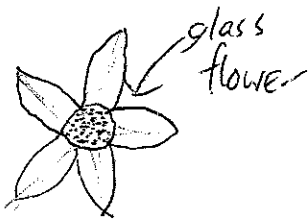
Stuff

This program must comply with the regulations of the Massachusetts Dept. of Public Health and must be licensed by the City of Newton Health Dept.

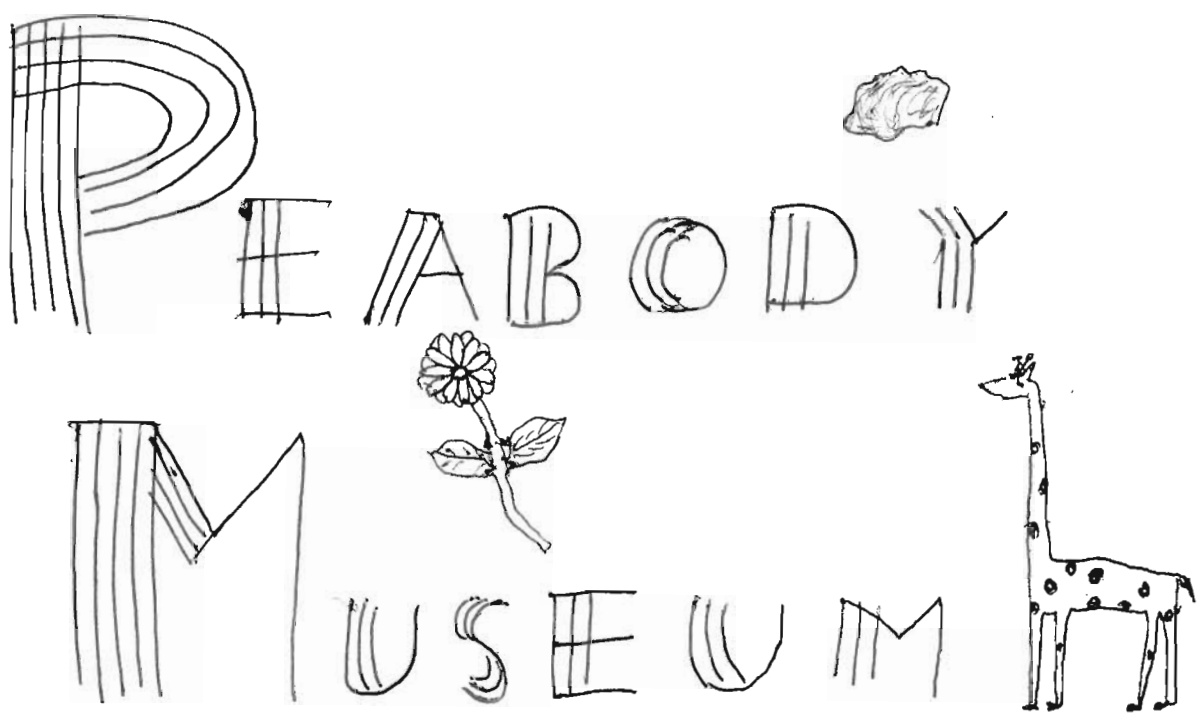

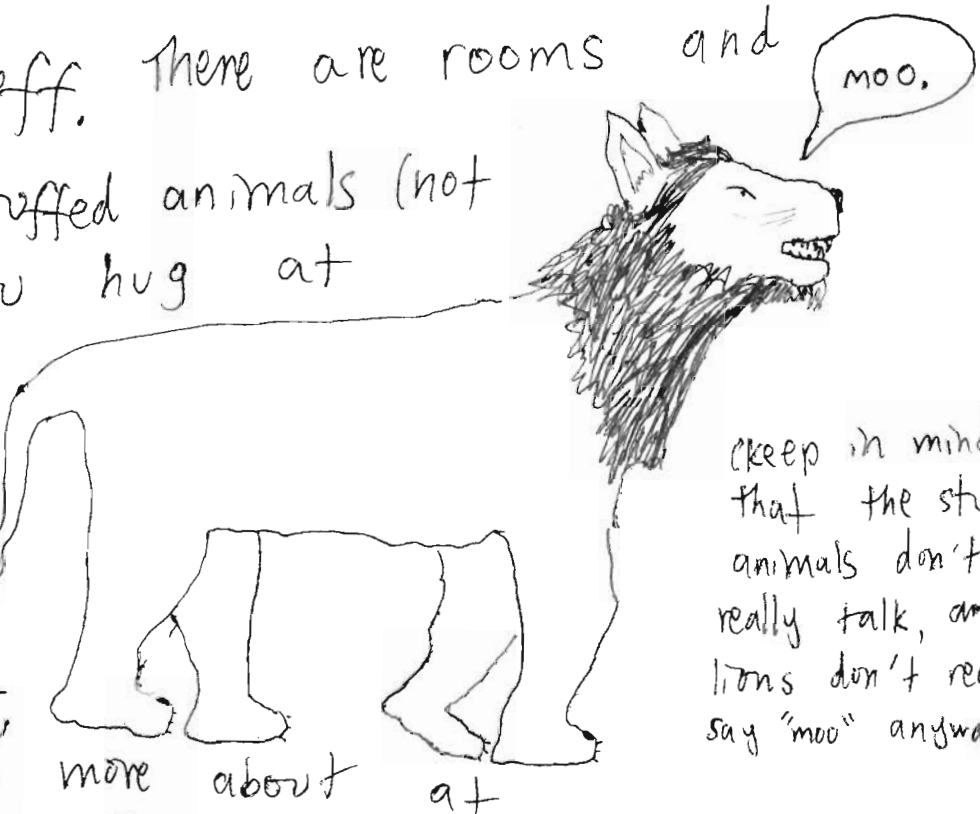

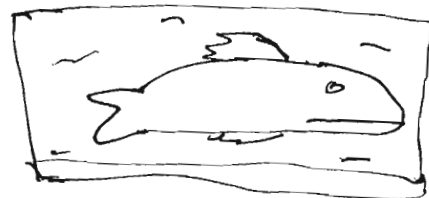
Today, we'll be going on a wild
