Types of Plate Boundaries.




Convergent



Drumlin: an elongated hill or ridge

Esker: long ridge of sand & gravel ^{moved by} glaciers

Kettle lakes: bowls or cavities in ground from glaciers

Moraine: buildup of stones & boulders carried by glaciers

RIDGE HILL RESERVATION

This place is dope. Jeff Wong (who beat up King Kong) reintroduced this trip to envi-sci several years ago, and since then it has become a staple of the envi-sci diet. It's not a very long bike trip, so we will have tons of time to walk around the 350-acre reservation. We will be following standard ESP bike procedure, meaning fixed order, turn signals, etc. For those of you who have yet to go on a bike trip this year (myself included) there will be a review at the start of the trip.

The reservation, as I'm sure Rivnay will tell you, is full of tons of different environments - forest, wetland, meadow, rivers - but what interests me is the big underlying question, mainly: **WHY?** Fortunately, the answer is something that I love to explain over and over and over and (slap!) sorry. I'm going to explain some glacial features, and then tomorrow we'll discuss both how they were formed, and where they can be seen in the reservation (definitions made possible by Sarina)

moraine: debris, like sand and gravel, that a glacier collects

drumlin: rounded mounds of rock and clay


glacial erratic: boulder "misplaced" by a glacier






